
# Communities Not Cages

### **RACE IS A DRIVING FACTOR OF INCARCERATION**

The racial disparities are staggering. In 2023, only 12% of Erie County's total population were Black, while 71% of peoplesentenced to prison were Black. Conversely, non-Hispanic white residents made up 77% of Erie County's total population, but just 18% of the prison sentences.


## 2023 POPULATION (18+) IN ERIE COUNTY BY RACE/ETHNICITY

## 2023 PRISON SENTENCES IN ERIE COUNTY BY RACE/ETHNICITY





#### **JAIL ADDMISSIONS BY ZIP CODE (JAN 1, 2020 TO MARCH 31, 2024)**



There were **2,193** jail admissions in an Erie County Correctional Facility of individuals who reside in zip code 14215, accounting for 14.61% of the total admissions in the county between 2020 and 2024. Conversely, there were **86** jail admissions of individuals who reside in zip code 14222, accounting for **0.57%** of the total admissions made in county during the same time period. 14215 residents are majority persons of color while residents 14222 are majority white. Communities of color and lower income communities—specifically the East Side, West Side, and Riverside are incarcerated at much higher rates than predominantly white and more affluent communities.
